Judge Tom Rickhoff Arbitrations

Judge Tom Rickhoff served for three decades as an elected Appellate, District, and Probate judge in Bexar County, Texas. As a probate judge, he reviewed over 3,000 medical records associated with guardianships and mental health cases annually. As a trial judge, he presided over many of the most significant trials in San Antonio ranging from multi-billion-dollar civil cases to capital murder trials.

Judge Rickhoff is currently a Senior Judge hearing civil, criminal, probate, tax, and condemnation cases.

For two decades, he was an adjunct associate professor at St. Mary's law school. In his private practice of law from 1974-77, he litigated civil and criminal jury trials and is licensed to practice in all Texas Federal and state courts.

He served as a Special Trial attorney for the U. S. Department of Justice Organized Crime Strike Force trying Mafia cases in New Orleans and then served as Chief of Special Crimes in the Western District of Texas prosecuting white collar crimes.

In 1970, he served as a captain in the 196th Combat Infantry brigade earning the Bronze Star and retired as a JAGC, USAR LTC.
