General remarks and official action taken:

The subject of this default order is whether a general lines agent license with a property and casualty qualification should be issued to Kristy Kay George (Respondent). Respondent did not respond to a Notice of Hearing filed by the Texas Department of Insurance or appear at the hearing on the merits. This order denies Respondent's license application.

The following findings of fact and conclusions of law are adopted:

Findings of Fact

Failure to Respond to Notice of Hearing

1. On April 1, 2020, the department filed a Notice of Hearing, attached as Exhibit A, and an Original Petition, attached as Exhibit B, with the State Office of Administrative Hearings.
2. The department's factual allegations set out in the attached Notice of Hearing and Original Petition are incorporated in this order as findings of fact.

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3. The department sent the Notice of Hearing and Original Petition to Respondent's last known address provided in writing to the department, [REDACTED] Texas 75002. The Notice of Hearing and Original Petition were also sent to [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Texas 75034. In addition, these documents were sent electronically to four email addresses associated with the Respondent.
4. Respondent failed to file a written response to the Notice of Hearing within 20 days of the date the Notice of Hearing and Original Petition were mailed.

Failure to Appear at Hearing on the Merits

5. After receiving proper notice of the date, time, and location of the hearing on the merits, Respondent failed to appear for the hearing on June 25, 2020, as shown in the record in SOAH Docket No. 454-20-3195.C.

Conditional Order of Default, Dismissal, and Remand

6. As shown in the record in SOAH Docket No. 454-20-3195.C, on June 30, 2020, Order No. 2 was issued by the Administrative Law Judge, conditionally dismissing and remanding this matter pursuant to 1 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 155.501(d)(1). It became final without further action by the Administrative Law Judge, unless Respondent filed a motion to set aside the default not later than 15 days from the date of that order.
7. Respondent did not file a motion to set aside the default.

Conclusions of Law

1. The commissioner has jurisdiction pursuant to Texas law, including TEX. INS. CODE §§ 82.051-82.055, 4001.002, 4005.101, 4005.102, 4051.051; TEX. GOV'T CODE §§ 2001.051-2001.178; 28 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 1.502; and TEX. OCC. CODE §§ 53.021-53.023.¹

¹ All citation to the Texas Occupations Code in this Order refers to the law in effect prior to H.B. 1342 (86th R.S.), effective September 1, 2019. Section 14 of H.B. 1342 states: "The changes in law made by this Act apply only to an application for a license submitted on or after the effective date of this Act. An application for a license submitted before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the application was submitted, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose."

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2. The commissioner has authority to dispose of this case informally pursuant to TEX. GOV'T CODE § 2001.056; TEX. INS. CODE § 82.055; and 28 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§ 1.47, 1.88, and 1.89.
3. The department provided proper notice of the hearing pursuant to TEX. GOV'T CODE §§ 2001.051, 2001.052, and 2001.054, and 28 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§ 1.28, 1.88, 1.89, and 19.906.
4. Based on Respondent's failure to file a written response to the Notice of Hearing and failure to appear in person or by legal representative at the hearing, the department is entitled to disposition by default pursuant to 28 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§ 1.88 and 1.89.
5. The department's factual and legal allegations set out in the attached Notice of Hearing and Original Petition are incorporated in this order and deemed admitted as true pursuant to 28 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 1.89.

Order

It is ordered that Kristy Kay George's application for a general lines agent license is denied. A copy of this order will be provided to law enforcement and/or other appropriate administrative agencies for further investigation as may be warranted.

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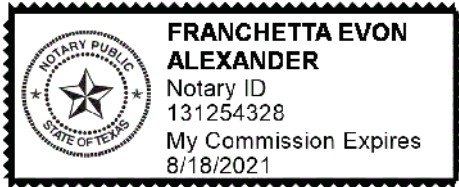

ORIGINAL PETITION

The Texas Department of Insurance seeks to deny Kristy Kay George's license application. In support of this petition, the department makes the following allegations upon information and belief:

Jurisdiction

The commissioner of insurance has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to TEX. INS. CODE §§ 82.051-82.055, 4001.002, 4005.101, 4005.102, 4051.051, TEX. GOV'T CODE §§ 2001.051-2001.178, 28 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 1.502, and TEX. OCC. CODE §§ 53.021-53.023.¹

Factual Allegations

Prior Licensure

1. Kristy Kay George ("George") previously held the following licenses with the department, all of which she failed to renew in accordance with TEX. INS. CODE § 4003.007:

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- a. George was issued a general lines agent license with a life, accident, health, and HMO qualification on March 23, 2000, which expired on March 23, 2010;
- b. George was issued a solicitor license on April 7, 2000, which was later converted to a property and casualty qualification under her general lines license on April 7, 2002, and which expired on March 23, 2010; and
- c. George was issued an adjuster license on March 29, 2004, which expired on March 29, 2008.

License Application

2. On July 12, 2018, George submitted an application to the department for a general lines agent license with a property and casualty qualification.
3. The department proposed to deny George's application on September 28, 2018, based on her criminal history. George appealed that decision and made a written request for a hearing.

Criminal History

4. On December 16, 2010, George was charged with two counts of Prescription Fraud, a felony, in the 416th District Court of Collin County, Texas, in case numbers 416-82818-2010 and 416-82819-2010.
5. The indictments filed in case numbers 416-82818-2010 and 416-82819-2010 stated that George did knowingly possess, obtain, and attempt to possess and obtain a controlled substance, hydrocodone, by misrepresentation, fraud, forgery, deception, and subterfuge through use of a fraudulent oral and telephonically communicated prescription.
6. George pled guilty to prescription fraud in case numbers 416-82818-2010 and 416-82819-2010, received deferred adjudication, and was placed on community supervision for four years in each case.
7. On August 27, 2015, the State of Texas filed a Petition to Enter a Final Adjudication of Defendant's Guilt in case numbers 416-82818-2010 and 416-82819-2010.

8. On March 14, 2016, George was found guilty of prescription fraud in case numbers 416-82818-2010 and 416-82819-2010, and sentenced to two years confinement in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice, to run concurrently.
9. On February 23, 2011, George was charged with theft of property greater or equal to \$50.00, but less than \$500.00, a Class B misdemeanor, in case number 006-80556-2011 in County Court at Law 6, Collin County, Texas. On August 12, 2011, George received deferred adjudication assessing 18 months of community supervision in case number 006-80556-2011.
10. On April 4, 2011, George was charged with theft of property greater or equal to \$50.00, but less than \$500.00, a Class B misdemeanor, in case number 006-82271-2011 in County Court at Law 6, Collin County, Texas. On August 12, 2011, George received deferred adjudication assessing 18 months of community supervision in case number 006-82271-2011.
11. On April 4, 2011, George was charged with possession of a dangerous drug, a Class A misdemeanor, in case number 006-82270-2011 in County Court at Law 6, Collin County, Texas. George received deferred adjudication assessing 18 months of community supervision in case number 006-82270-2011.
12. On April 4, 2011, George was charged with possession of a controlled substance, in an amount greater than three grams, but less than 28 grams, a Class A misdemeanor, in case number 006-82272-2011 in County Court at Law 6, Collin County, Texas. On August 12, 2011, George received deferred adjudication assessing 18 months of community supervision in case number 006-82272-2011.
13. On April 15, 2011, George was charged with possession of a controlled substance in an amount greater than three grams, but less than 28 grams, a Class A misdemeanor, in case number 003-82626-2011 in County Court at Law 6, Collin County, Texas. On August 12, 2011, George received deferred adjudication assessing 18 months of community supervision in case number 003-82626-2011.
14. On April 15, 2011, George was charged with possession of a dangerous drug, a Class A misdemeanor, in case number 003-82627-2011 in County Court at Law 6, Collin County, Texas. On August 12, 2011, George received deferred adjudication assessing 18 months of community supervision in case number 003-82627-2011.

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15. On July 22, 2011, George was charged with driving while intoxicated, a Class B misdemeanor, in case number 006-84882-2011 in County Court at Law 6, Collin County, Texas. On August 12, 2011, George was found guilty and received four days confinement in the Collin County jail, in case number 006-84882-2011.
16. On August 22, 2013, George was charged with driving while intoxicated, a Class A misdemeanor, in case number 006-85423-2013 in County Court at Law 6, Collin County, Texas. On July 31, 2014, George was found guilty and received two years of community supervision, in case number 006-85423-2013.
17. On February 12, 2016, George's probation in case number 006-85423-2013 was revoked and she received 50 days confinement.
18. On February 2, 2016, George was charged with possession of a controlled substance in penalty group one of less than one gram, a state jail felony, in case number 416-80273-2016 in the 416th District Court of Collin County, Texas. George was found guilty, in case number 416-80273-2016, and sentenced to 180 days confinement in state jail.
19. On March 15, 2018, George was arrested for criminal trespass and charged on June 20, 2018, in case number MB1810154, in County Criminal Court 8, Dallas County, Texas. On January 24, 2019, George was found guilty of misdemeanor criminal trespass and sentenced to three days confinement in case number MB1810154.

Material Misstatement on License Application and Attempt to Obtain License by Misrepresentation

20. The Application asked George, "Have you ever been convicted of a misdemeanor, had a judgment withheld or deferred, or are you currently charged with committing a misdemeanor?" The Application informed George that she may exclude misdemeanor convictions for traffic citations, driving under the influence, driving while intoxicated, driving without a license, reckless driving, driving with a suspended or revoked license, and any juvenile adjudications.
21. In George's Application, she answered "no" to that question, falsely stating she had not been convicted of the above-described misdemeanors, had judgments deferred, and that she was not currently charged with a misdemeanor.

22. Prior to the submission of her application for licensure with the department, George was arrested and charged on June 21, 2018 with possession of marijuana in case number MB1810155, in County Criminal Court 8, Dallas County, Texas. On January 24, 2019, case number MB1810155 was dismissed.

Legal Allegations

1. George has intentionally made a material misstatement in her license application, as contemplated by TEX. INS. CODE § 4005.101(b)(2).
2. George has attempted to obtain a license by fraud or misrepresentation, as contemplated by TEX. INS. CODE § 4005.101(b)(3).
3. George has engaged in fraudulent or dishonest acts or practices, as contemplated by TEX. INS. CODE § 4005.101(b)(5).
4. George has been convicted of a felony, as contemplated by TEX. INS. CODE § 4005.101(b)(8) and TEX. OCC. CODE § 53.021(a).
5. George has committed felony and misdemeanor offenses and has engaged in fraudulent or dishonest activity that directly relate to the duties and responsibilities of the licensed occupation, as contemplated in 28 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 1.502(d) and (f).
6. George committed offenses that the department considers to be of such a serious nature that it is of prime importance in determining fitness for licensure, as contemplated by 28 TEX ADMIN. CODE § 1.502(e)(1) and (e)(4)(F), and TEX. OCC. CODE §§ 53.021 – 53.023.
7. Department guidelines, 28 TEX ADMIN. CODE § 1.502(c)-(e), emphasize that the department:
 - a. considers it very important that applicants be honest, trustworthy, and reliable;
 - b. may refuse to issue an original license if the department determines that the applicant has committed a felony or misdemeanor that directly relates to the duties and responsibilities of the licensed occupation;

- c. considers the offense of Prescription Fraud to be of such a serious nature that it is of prime importance when determining fitness for licensure. 28 TEX ADMIN. CODE § 1.502(e)(1); and
 - d. considers the offense of Theft of Property to be of such a serious nature that it is of prime importance when determining fitness for licensure. 28 TEX ADMIN. CODE § 1.502(e)(4)(F).
8. George has been convicted of a felony involving dishonesty or breach of trust, as specified in 18 U.S.C. § 1033 and requiring written consent from the commissioner of insurance to engage or participate in the business of insurance.

Relief Sought

If one or more of the above allegations is found to be true, the department asks the Administrative Law Judge to enter a Proposal for Decision recommending that the Commissioner of Insurance issue an order:

- 1. denying Kristy Kay George's license application;
- 2. denying consent to allow Kristy Kay George to engage or participate in the business of insurance under 18 U.S.C. § 1033; and
- 3. any other just and appropriate relief to which the department may be entitled to by law, including any combination of the above actions.

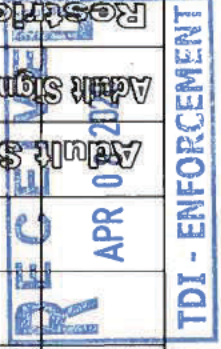

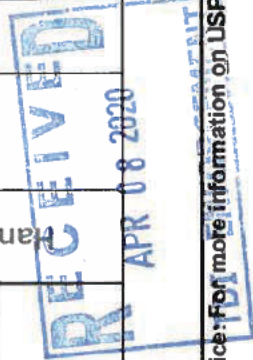
