#### FINDINGS AND DECISION

This medical fee dispute is decided pursuant to Texas Labor Code §413.031 and applicable rules of the Texas Department of Insurance, Division of Workers' Compensation.

**Background**

- 28 Texas Administrative Code §133.307 sets out the procedures for resolving medical fee disputes.
- 28 Texas Administrative Code §134.403 sets out the fee guidelines for outpatient services.
- 28 Texas Administrative Code §134.203 sets out the guidelines for professional medical services.
- The insurance carrier reduced payment for the disputed services with the following claim adjustment codes:
  - P12 – Workers' compensation jurisdictional fee schedule adjustment
  - 163 – The charge for this procedure exceeds the unit value and/or the multiple procedure rules

- 170 – Reimbursement is based on the outpatient/inpatient fee schedule
- 119 – Benefit maximum for this time period or occurrence has been reached

### Issues

1. What rule is applicable to reimbursement?
2. Is the requestor entitled to additional reimbursement?

### Findings

1. The requestor is seeking additional reimbursement for outpatient therapy services performed from April 18 – 25, 2018. The carrier reduced the allowed amount as P12 – “Workers’ compensation jurisdictional fee schedule adjustment” and 163 – “The charge for this procedure exceeds the unit value and/or the multiple procedure rules.”

The applicable Division Rule is found in 28 Texas Administrative Code 134.403. The applicable sections are listed below:

(d) For coding, billing, reporting, and reimbursement of health care covered in this section, Texas workers' compensation system participants shall apply Medicare payment policies in effect on the date a service is provided

(f) The reimbursement calculation used for establishing the MAR shall be the Medicare facility specific amount, including outlier payment amounts, determined by applying the most recently adopted and effective Medicare Outpatient Prospective Payment System (OPPS) reimbursement formula and factors as published annually in the Federal Register.

(h) For medical services provided in an outpatient acute care hospital, but not addressed in the Medicare payment policies as outlined in subsections (f)(1) or (f)(2) of this section, and for which Medicare reimburses using other Medicare fee schedules, reimbursement shall be made using the applicable Division Fee Guideline in effect for that service on the date the service was provided.

The OPPS reimbursement formula factors are found at <https://www.cms.gov/Medicare/Medicare-Fee-for-Service-Payment/HospitalOutpatientPPS/Addendum-A-and-Addendum-B-Updates.html>. The specific factor is the Status Indicators. The status indicator for each of the HCPCS code listed on the DWC060 have an “A” status indicator which is defined as, “Not paid under OPPS. Paid by MACs under a fee schedule or payment system other than OPPS.”

Based on the requirements of 28 Texas Administrative Code §134.403 (h) the applicable Division fee Guideline is found in 28 Texas Administrative Code §134.203.

On April 1st of 2013, Medicare implemented the Medicare Multiple Procedure Payment Reduction (MPPR). The MPPR policy may be found in the CMS Claims Processing Manual 100-04, Chapter 5, section 10.7 found at [www.cms.gov](http://www.cms.gov). The MPPR policy applies and was used in the calculation of the maximum allowable reimbursement shown below.

2. 28 Texas Administrative Code §134.203 (c) states, “To determine the MAR for professional services, system participants shall apply the Medicare payment policies with minimal modifications.”

The MAR is calculated by the DWC Conversion Factor of 58.31/Medicare Conversion Factor 35.9996 multiplied by the Medicare allowable. **To ensure the appropriate application of the MPPR reductions all services billed for each date will be calculated.** The calculation is as follows:

- Procedure code 97110, billed April 18, 2018 for has a PE of 0.4 not the highest for this date and will be paid at the reduced rate of \$23.95.  $58.31/35.9996 \times 23.95 = \$38.79$
- Procedure code 97140, billed April 18, 2018 has a PE of 0.35 not the highest for this date and will be paid at the reduced allowable of \$22.07.  $58.31/35.9996 \times \$22.07 = \$35.75$
- Procedure code 97161, billed April 18, 2018 has a PE of 1.13 the highest for this dated and will be paid at the full allowable of \$84.96.  $58.31/35.9996 \times \$84.96 = \$137.61$

- Procedure code 97110, billed April 23, 2018 has a PE of 0.4 not the highest for this date and will be paid at the reduced rate of \$23.95.  $58.31/35.9996 \times 23.95 = \$38.79$
- Procedure code 97140, billed April 23, 2018 has a PE of 0.35 the highest for this date and will be paid at the full allowable of \$28.28.  $58.31/35.9996 \times \$28.28 = \$45.81$
- Procedure code 97110, billed April 25, 2018 has a PE of 0.4 not the highest for this date and will be paid at the reduced rate of \$23.95.  $58.31/35.9996 \times 23.95 = \$38.79$
- Procedure code 97140, billed April 25, 2018 has a PE of 0.35 the highest for this date and will be paid at the full allowable of \$28.28.  $58.31/35.9996 \times \$28.28 = \$45.81$

The total allowed amount is \$381.35. The carrier paid \$384.23. No additional payment is due.

**Conclusion**

For the reasons stated above, the Division finds that the requestor has not established that additional reimbursement is due. As a result, the amount ordered is \$0.00.

**ORDER**

Based upon the documentation submitted by the parties and in accordance with the provisions of Texas Labor Code §413.031, the Division has determined that the requestor is entitled to \$0.00 reimbursement for the disputed services.

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**YOUR RIGHT TO APPEAL**

Either party to this medical fee dispute has a right to seek review of this decision in accordance with Rule §133.307, effective May 31, 2012, *37 Texas Register 3833*, **applicable to disputes filed on or after June 1, 2012.**

A party seeking review must submit a **Request to Schedule a Benefit Review Conference to Appeal a Medical Fee Dispute Decision** (form **DWC045M**) in accordance with the instructions on the form. The request must be received by the division within **twenty** days of your receipt of this decision. The request may be faxed, mailed or personally delivered to the division using the contact information listed on the form or to the field office handling the claim.

The party seeking review of the MFDR decision shall deliver a copy of the request to all other parties involved in the dispute at the same time the request is filed. **Please include a copy of the *Medical Fee Dispute Resolution Findings and Decision*** together with any other required information specified in 28 Texas Administrative Code §141.1(d).
