FINDINGS AND DECISION

This medical fee dispute is decided pursuant to Texas Labor Code §413.031 and applicable rules of the Texas Department of Insurance, Division of Workers' Compensation.

Background

- 1. 28 Texas Administrative Code §133.307 sets out the procedures for resolving medical fee disputes.
- 2. 28 Texas Administrative Code §134.403 sets out the reimbursement guidelines for outpatient hospital services.
- 3. The insurance carrier reduced payment for the disputed services with the following claim adjustment codes:
 - P12 Workers' compensation jurisdictional fee schedule adjustment

<u>Issues</u>

- 1. What is the applicable rule for determining reimbursement for the disputed services?
- 2. Is the requestor entitled to additional reimbursement?

Findings

- 1. The requestor is seeking additional reimbursement in the amount of \$18.10 for outpatient hospital services rendered on November 29, 2018. The insurance carrier reduced disputed services based on workers' compensation fee schedule.
 - 28 Texas Administrative Code §134.403 (d) states in pertinent part,

For coding, billing, reporting, and reimbursement of health care covered in this section, Texas workers' compensation system participants shall apply Medicare payment policies in effect on the date a service is provided

The Medicare payment policy applicable to the services in dispute is found at www.cms.gov, Claims processing Manual, Chapter 4, Section 10.1.1 - Payment Status Indicators

An OPPS payment status indicator is assigned to every HCPCS code. The status indicator identifies whether the service described by the HCPCS code is paid under the OPPS and if so, whether payment is made separately or packaged. The status indicator may also provide additional information about how the code is paid under the OPPS or under another payment system or fee schedule.

28 TAC §134.403, (f) states,

The reimbursement calculation used for establishing the MAR shall be the Medicare facility specific amount, including outlier payment amounts, determined by applying the most recently adopted and effective Medicare Outpatient Prospective Payment System (OPPS) reimbursement formula and factors as published annually in the *Federal Register*. The following minimal modifications shall be applied.

- (1) The sum of the Medicare facility specific reimbursement amount and any applicable outlier payment amount shall be multiplied by:
 - (A) 200 percent; unless
 - (B) a facility or surgical implant provider requests separate reimbursement in accordance with subsection (g) of this section, in which case the facility specific reimbursement amount and any applicable outlier payment amount shall be multiplied by 130 percent.

Implants were not provided. The maximum allowable reimbursement per the above is calculated as follows:

- Procedure code 70450 has status indicator Q3, for conditionally packaged codes paid as a composite if OPPS criteria are met. As packaging criteria were not met, this line is separate. This code is assigned APC 5522. The OPPS Addendum A rate is \$114.46, multiplied by 60% for an unadjusted labor amount of \$68.68, in turn multiplied by the facility wage index of 0.9736 for an adjusted labor amount of \$66.87. The non-labor portion is 40% of the APC rate, or \$45.78. The sum of the labor and non-labor portions is \$112.65. The Medicare facility specific amount of \$112.65 is multiplied by 200% for a MAR of \$225.30.
- Procedure code 96374 has status indicator S, for procedures not subject to reduction. This code is assigned APC 5693. The OPPS Addendum A rate is \$191.09, multiplied by 60% for an unadjusted labor amount of \$114.65, in turn multiplied by the facility wage index of 0.9736 for an adjusted labor amount of \$111.62. The non-labor portion is 40% of the APC rate, or \$76.44. The sum of the labor and non-labor portions is \$188.06. The Medicare facility specific amount of \$188.06 is multiplied by 200% for a MAR of \$376.12.
- Procedure code 96375 has status indicator S, for procedures not subject to reduction. This code is assigned APC 5691. The OPPS Addendum A rate is \$37.03, multiplied by 60% for an unadjusted labor amount of \$22.22, in turn multiplied by the facility wage index of 0.9736 for an adjusted labor amount of \$21.63. The non-labor portion is 40% of the APC rate, or \$14.81. The sum of the labor and non-labor portions is \$36.44. The Medicare facility specific amount of \$36.44 is multiplied by 200% for a MAR of \$72.88.

- Procedure code 99284 has status indicator of V as the criteria for comprehensive packaging (J2) is not met. This code is assigned APC 5024. The OPPS Addendum A rate is \$355.53, multiplied by 60% for an unadjusted labor amount of \$213.32, in turn multiplied by the facility wage index of 0.9736 for an adjusted labor amount of \$207.69. The non-labor portion is 40% of the APC rate, or \$142.21. The sum of the labor and non-labor portions is \$349.90. The cost of services does not exceed the threshold for outlier payment. The Medicare facility specific amount of \$349.90 is multiplied by 200% for a MAR of \$699.80.
- Procedure code G0390 has status indicator S, for procedures not subject to reduction. This code is assigned APC 5045. The OPPS Addendum A rate is \$957.57, multiplied by 60% for an unadjusted labor amount of \$574.54, in turn multiplied by the facility wage index of 0.9736 for an adjusted labor amount of \$559.37. The non-labor portion is 40% of the APC rate, or \$383.03. The sum of the labor and non-labor portions is \$942.40. The cost of services does not exceed the threshold for outlier payment. The Medicare facility specific amount of \$942.40 is multiplied by 200% for a MAR of \$1,884.80.
- 2. The total recommended reimbursement for the disputed services is \$3,258.90. The insurance carrier paid \$3,239.04. The requestor is seeking additional reimbursement of \$18.10. This amount is recommended.

Conclusion

For the reasons stated above, the Division finds that the requestor has established that additional reimbursement is due. As a result, the amount ordered is \$18.10.

ORDER

Based on the submitted information, pursuant to Texas Labor Code Section 413.031 and 413.019 (if applicable), the division has determined the requestor is entitled to additional reimbursement for the disputed services. The division hereby ORDERS the respondent to remit to the requestor \$18.10, plus applicable accrued interest per 28 Texas Administrative Code §134.130, due within 30 days of receipt of this order.

The party seeking review of the MFDR decision shall deliver a copy of the request to all other parties involved in the dispute at the same time the request is filed. **Please include a copy of the** *Medical Fee Dispute Resolution Findings* **and** *Decision* together with any other required information specified in 28 Texas Administrative Code §141.1(d).
