AUTHORITY

This medical fee dispute is decided pursuant to Texas Labor Code §413.031 and rules of the Texas Department of Insurance, Division of Workers' Compensation (DWC) in Title 28, Part 2 of the Texas Administrative Code.

Background

- 1. 28 Texas Administrative Code §133.307 sets out the procedures for resolving medical fee disputes.
2. 28 Texas Administrative Code §134.403 sets out the hospital facility fee guideline for outpatient services.
3. 28 Texas Administrative Code §134.203 sets out the fee guideline for professional medical services.
4. The insurance carrier reduced payment for the disputed services with the following claim adjustment codes:
- 150 - Payer deems the information submitted does not support this level of service.
- 45 - Charge exceeds fee schedule/maximum allowable or contracted legislated fee arrangement.
- 97 - Payment adjusted because The benefit for this service is included in the payment/allowance for another service/procedure that has already been adjudicated.
- W3 - Additional payment made on appeal/reconsideration.
- 193 - Original payment decision is being maintained. Upon review, it was determined that this claim was processed properly.
- 906 - In accordance with clinical based coding edits (National Correct Coding Initiative/Outpatient Code Editor), component code of comprehensive medicine, evaluation and management services procedure (90000-99999) has been disallowed.
- 1115 - We find the original review to be accurate and are unable to recommend any additional allowance.

Issues

Is the requestor entitled to additional reimbursement?

Findings

This dispute regards outpatient physical therapy services not paid under Medicare's Outpatient Prospective Payment System but under Medicare's Physician Fee Schedule. *DWC Hospital Fee Guideline*, 28 Texas Administrative Code §134.403(h) requires use of the fee guideline applicable to the code on the date of service if Medicare pays using other fee schedules. *DWC Professional Fee Guideline*, Rule 28 TAC §134.203(c) determines the maximum allowable reimbursement (MAR) using Medicare payment policies modified by DWC rules. The MAR is the sum of the geographically adjusted work, practice expense and malpractice values multiplied by a DWC conversion factor.

Medicare's multiple-procedure payment reduction (MPPR) policy requires payment in full for the first unit of therapy with the highest practice expense. Payment is reduced by 50% of the practice expense for each extra therapy unit (codes with multiple-procedure indicator 5) provided on the same day.

Reimbursement is calculated as follows:

- Procedure code 97140 (May 9, 2019) has a Work RVU of 0.43 multiplied by the Work GPCI of 1 is 0.43. The practice expense RVU of 0.35 multiplied by the PE GPCI of 0.938 is 0.3283. The malpractice RVU of 0.01 multiplied by the malpractice GPCI of 0.796 is 0.00796. The sum is 0.76626 multiplied by the DWC conversion factor of \$59.19 for a rate of \$45.35. The PE for this code is not the highest; payment is reduced by 50% of the practice expense. The PE reduced rate is \$35.64 at 2 units the MAR is \$71.28. The carrier paid \$71.28. No additional is due.
- Procedure code G0283 (May 9, 2019) has a Work RVU of 0.18 multiplied by the Work GPCI of 1 is 0.18. The practice expense RVU of 0.21 multiplied by the PE GPCI of 0.938 is 0.19698. The malpractice RVU of 0.01 multiplied by the malpractice GPCI of 0.796 is 0.00796. The sum is 0.38494 multiplied by the DWC conversion factor of \$59.19 for a rate of \$22.78. The PE for this code is not the highest; payment is reduced by 50% of the practice expense. The PE reduced rate is \$16.95. The carrier paid \$16.95. No additional payment is due.
- Procedure code 97032 (May 21, 2019) has a Work RVU of 0.25 multiplied by the Work GPCI of 1 is 0.25. The practice expense RVU of 0.16 multiplied by the PE GPCI of 0.938 is 0.15008. The malpractice RVU of 0.01 multiplied by the malpractice GPCI of 0.796 is 0.00796. The sum is 0.40804 multiplied by the DWC conversion factor of \$59.19 for a MAR of \$24.15. The PE for this code is not the highest; payment is reduced by 50% of the practice expense. The PE reduced rate is \$19.71. The carrier paid \$19.71. No additional payment is due.
- Procedure code 97140 (May 23, 2019) has a Work RVU of 0.43 multiplied by the Work GPCI of 1 is 0.43. The practice expense RVU of 0.35 multiplied by the PE GPCI of 0.938 is 0.3283. The malpractice RVU of 0.01 multiplied by the malpractice GPCI of 0.796 is 0.00796. The sum is 0.76626 multiplied by the DWC conversion factor of \$59.19 for a rate of \$45.35. The PE for this code is not the highest; payment is reduced by 50% of the practice expense. The PE reduced rate is \$35.64 at 2 units the MAR is \$71.28. The carrier paid \$71.28. No additional is due.
- Procedure code 97012 (May 31, 2019) has a Work RVU of 0.25 multiplied by the Work GPCI of 1 is 0.25. The practice expense RVU of 0.16 multiplied by the PE GPCI of 0.938 is 0.15008. The malpractice RVU of 0.01 multiplied by the malpractice GPCI of 0.796 is 0.00796. The sum is 0.40804 multiplied by the DWC conversion factor of \$59.19 for a MAR of \$24.15. This code has the highest PE for this date. The first unit is paid at \$24.15. The carrier paid \$24.16. No additional payment is due.
- Per Medicare policy regarding Correct Coding Initiative (CCI) edits, procedure code 97140 (May 31, 2019) may not be reported with code 97012 billed on this same date. Payment is included in the reimbursement for code 97012.

The total allowable reimbursement for the disputed services is \$253.16. The insurance carrier paid \$253.16. No additional payment is recommended.

Conclusion

For the reasons above, the requestor failed to establish additional payment is due. The amount ordered is \$0.00.

ORDER

In accordance with Texas Labor Code §413.031, based on the information submitted for review, DWC hereby determines the requestor is entitled to \$0.00 additional reimbursement for the services in dispute.
