REQUESTOR'S POSITION SUMMARY

Requestor's Position Summary: "On February 23, 2021 Dr. Rafath, Quraishi was ordered by the Division of Workers' Compensation to perform an MMI/IR to determine if he has met MMI. We billed a total of \$500.00 for MMI/IR Evaluation with CPT code 99456-W5WP (X1 Units) ... It is our position that the carrier has denied payment of the service provided inappropriately and is responsible for the additional \$150.00 still owed for the IR portion of the exam. DWC Rules clearly states a 0% IR does not allow carrier to avoid payment."

Amount in Dispute: \$150.00

RESPONDENT'S POSITION SUMMARY

Submitted documentation does not include a position statement from the respondent. Accordingly, this decision is based on the information available at the time of adjudication.

FINDINGS AND DECISION

This medical fee dispute is decided pursuant to Texas Labor Code §413.031 and applicable rules of the Texas Department of Insurance, Division of Workers' Compensation (DWC).

Background

- 28 Texas Administrative Code §133.307 sets out the procedures for resolving medical fee disputes.
- 28 Texas Administrative Code §134.250 sets out the fee guidelines for examinations to determine maximum medical improvement and impairment rating.
- The insurance carrier reduced payment for the disputed services with the following claim adjustment codes:
 - P12 – Workers' compensation jurisdictional fee schedule adjustment.
 - 309 – The charge for this procedure exceeds the fee schedule allowance.

- 4150 – An allowance has been paid for a designated doctor examination as outlined in 134.204(j) for attainment of maximum medical improvement. An additional allowance
- B13 – Previously paid. Payment for this claim/service may have been provided in a previous payment.
- 247 – A payment or denial has already been recommended for this service.

Issues

1. Did Safety National Casualty Company respond to the medical fee dispute?
2. Is Rafath Quraishi, M.D. entitled to additional reimbursement for the examination in question?

Findings

1. The Austin carrier representative for Safety National Casualty Company is Flahive Ogden & Latson. The representative was notified of this medical fee dispute on May 11, 2021. If the DWC does not receive the response within 14 calendar days of the dispute notification, then the DWC may base its decision on the available information.¹

As of today, no response has been received from the insurance carrier or its representative. We will base this decision on the information available.

2. Dr. Quraishi is seeking additional reimbursement for an examination to determine maximum medical improvement and impairment rating.

The submitted documentation supports that Dr. Quraishi performed an evaluation of maximum medical improvement as ordered by the DWC. The maximum allowable reimbursement (MAR) for this examination is \$350.00.²

The submitted documentation supports that Dr. Quraishi provided an impairment rating of the spine. The MAR for the evaluation of a musculoskeletal body area determined using the DRE method is \$150.00.³

The total allowable reimbursement is \$500.00. The insurance carrier paid \$350.00. An additional reimbursement of \$150.00 is recommended.

Conclusion

The outcome of each independent medical fee dispute relies upon the relevant evidence presented by the requestor and the respondent at the time of adjudication. Though all the evidence in this dispute may not have been discussed, it was considered. For the reasons stated above, the Texas Department of Insurance, Division of Workers’ Compensation (DWC) finds that the requestor has established that additional reimbursement is due. As a result, the amount ordered is \$150.00.

ORDER

Based on the submitted information, pursuant to Texas Labor Code Section 413.031 and 413.019 (if applicable), the DWC has determined the requestor is entitled to additional reimbursement for the disputed services. The DWC hereby ORDERS the respondent to remit to the requestor \$150.00, plus applicable accrued interest per 28 Texas Administrative Code §134.130, due within 30 days of receipt of this order.

YOUR RIGHT TO APPEAL

Either party to this medical fee dispute has a right to seek review of this decision in accordance with Rule §133.307, effective May 31, 2012, *37 Texas Register 3833*, **applicable to disputes filed on or after June 1, 2012.**

A party seeking review must submit a **Request to Schedule a Benefit Review Conference to Appeal a Medical Fee Dispute Decision** (form **DWC045M**) in accordance with the instructions on the form. The request must be received by the DWC within **twenty** days of your receipt of this decision. The request may be faxed, mailed, or personally delivered to the DWC using the contact information listed on the form or to the field office handling the claim.

The party seeking review of the MFDR decision shall deliver a copy of the request to all other parties involved in the dispute at the same time the request is filed. **Please include a copy of the *Medical Fee Dispute Resolution Findings and Decision*** together with any other required information specified in 28 Texas Administrative Code §141.1(d).
