

## Medical Fee Dispute Resolution Findings and Decision

### Requestor's Position

This claim should be processed with the full amount billed as per Administrative Labor Code 134.503 © as well as by the direct carrier, not an alternate vendor. The carrier needs to pay for \$366.62.

**Amount in Dispute:** \$366.62

### Respondent's Position

The Austin carrier representative for Safety National Casualty Corp is Flahive Ogden and Latson. The representative was notified of this medical fee dispute on October 4, 2021.

Per 28 Texas Administrative Code §133.307(d)(1), if the DWC does not receive the response within 14 calendar days of the dispute notification, then the DWC may base its decision on the available information.

As of today, no response has been received from the insurance carrier or its representative. We

will base this decision on the information available.

## Findings and Decision

### Authority

This medical fee dispute is decided according to Texas Labor Code §413.031 and applicable rules of the Texas Department of Insurance, Division of Workers' Compensation (DWC).

### Statutes and Rules

1. 28 TAC §133.307 sets out the procedures for resolving medical fee disputes.
2. 28 TAC §134.503 sets out the fee guidelines for oral medications.

### Denial Reasons

Neither party submitted an explanation of benefits for the disputed services.

### Issues

1. What rule(s) apply to disputed services?

### Findings

1. The requestor is seeking reimbursement for oral medication dispensed in July 2021. Insufficient evidence was found to support the adjudication of the medical bill for the disputed medication. The service in dispute will be reviewed per applicable fee guideline.

DWC Rule 28 Texas Administrative Code §134.503 (c) states the insurance carrier shall reimburse the health care provider or pharmacy processing agent for prescription drugs the lesser of the fee established by the following formulas based on the average wholesale price (AWP) as reported by a nationally recognized pharmaceutical price guide or other publication of pharmaceutical pricing data in effect on the day the prescription drug is dispensed:

- Generic drugs:  $((\text{AWP per unit}) \times (\text{number of units}) \times 1.25) + \$4.00$  dispensing fee per prescription = reimbursement amount;

The total reimbursement is \$196.02 This amount is recommended.

### Conclusion

The outcome of this medical fee dispute is based on the evidence presented by the requestor and the respondent at the time of adjudication. Though all evidence may not have been discussed, it was considered.

DWC finds the requester has established that additional reimbursement is due.

## Order

Under Texas Labor Code §§413.031 and 413.019, DWC has determined the requestor is entitled to additional reimbursement for the disputed services. It is ordered that Safety National Casualty Corp must remit to Memorial Compounding RX \$196.02 plus applicable accrued interest within 30 days of receiving this order in accordance with 28 TAC §134.130.

Either party to this medical fee dispute has a right to seek review of this decision under 28 TAC §133.307, which applies to disputes filed on or after **June 1, 2012**.

A party seeking review must submit DWC Form-045M, *Request to Schedule, Reschedule, or Cancel a Benefit Review Conference to Appeal a Medical Fee Dispute Decision (BRC-MFD)* and follow the instructions on the form. DWC must receive the request within **20 days** of when you receive this decision.
