Requestor's Position

The requestor did not subnmit a position statement but did subnit a copy of their reconsideration that states, "According to TX workers compensation fee schedule the expected reimbursement for DOS 11/11/2021is \$12,235.20. Previous payment received totaled \$9,166.68 leaving a balance of \$3,068.52."

Amount in Dispute: \$3,068.52

Respondent's Position

"Please see the EOBs included in with Requestor's DWC-60. The Carrier has paid a total of \$9,166.68. This amount was inclusive of the entire surgical procedure, the APC rate plus the markup.."

Findings and Decision

<u>Authority</u>

This medical fee dispute is decided according to Texas Labor Code §413.031 and applicable rules of the Texas Department of Insurance, Division of Workers' Compensation (DWC).

Statutes and Rules

- 1. 28 TAC §133.307 sets out the procedures for resolving medical fee disputes.
- 2. 28 TAC §134.403 sets out the fee guidelines for outpatient hospital services.

Denial Reasons

The insurance carrier reduced/ denied the payment for the disputed services with the following claim adjustment codes:

- 350 Bill has been identified as a request for reconsideration
- 353 -This charge was reviewed per the attached invoice
- 370 The hospital outpatient allowance was calculated according to the APC rate plus a markup
- 397 Allowance based on utilization review pre-authorization
- 45 Charge exceeds fee schedule/maximum allowable or contracted/legislated fee arrangement. Usage this adjustment amount cannot equal the total service or claim charge amount, and must not dupliocate provider adjustment amounts (payments and contractual.
- 618 The value of this procedure is packaged into the payment of other services performed on the same date of service
- P12 Workers' compensation jurisdictional fee schedule adjustment

<u>lssues</u>

- 1. What rule applies for determining reimbursement for the disputed services?
- 2. Is the requester entitled to additional reimbursement?

<u>Findings</u>

1. DWC Rule 28 TAC §134.403 (d) requires Texas workers' compensation system participants when coding, billing, reporting and reimbursement to apply Medicare payment policies in effect on the date of service.

The Medicare payment policy applicable to the services in dispute is found at <u>www.cms.gov</u>, Claims processing Manual, Chapter 4, Section 10.1.1. Specifically, Payment Status Indicators and Ambulatory Payment Category (APC).

DWC Rule 28 TAC 134.403 (f) states in pertinent part the reimbursement calculation used for establishing the MAR shall be the Medicare facility specific amount, including outlier payment amounts, determined by applying the most recently adopted and effective Medicare Outpatient Prospective Payment System (OPPS) reimbursement formula and factors as published annually in the *Federal Register*.

The Medicare facility specific amount is calculated when the APC payment rate is multiplied by 60% to determine the labor portion. This amount is multiplied by the facility wage index for the date of service. The non-labor amount is determined when the APC payment rate is multiplied by 40%. The sum of the labor portion multiplied by the facility wage index and the non-labor portion determines the Medicare specific amount.

DWC Rule 28 TAC 134.403 (e) (2) states in pertientn part Regardless of billed amount, reimbursement shall be if no contracted fee schedules exists that complies with labor Code 413.011, the maximum allowable reimbursement (MAR) amount under subsection (f) including any applicable outlier payment amounts and reimbursement for implantables.

Review of the submitted medical bill and the applicable fee guidelines referenced above is shown below.

• Procedure code 25609 has status indicator J1. All covered services on the bill are packaged with the primary "J1" procedure. This code is assigned APC 5114.

The OPPS Addendum A rate is \$5,981.95 multiplied by 60% for an unadjusted labor amount of \$3,589.17, in turn multiplied by facility wage index 0.9671 for an adjusted labor amount of \$3,471.09.

The non-labor portion is 40% of the APC rate, or \$2,392.78.

The sum of the labor and non-labor portions is \$5,863.87.

The Medicare facility specific amount is \$6,264.95 multiplied by 200% for a MAR of \$12,529.90.

2. The total recommended reimbursement for the disputed services is \$12,529.90. The insurance carrier paid \$9,166.68. The requestor is seeking \$3,068.52. This amount is recommended.

Conclusion

The outcome of this medical fee dispute is based on the evidence presented by the requestor and the respondent at the time of adjudication. Though all evidence may not have been discussed, it was considered.

DWC finds the requester has established that additional reimbursement of \$3,068.52 is due.

Order

Under Texas Labor Code §§413.031 and 413.019, DWC has determined the requestor is entitled to additional reimbursement for the disputed services. It is ordered that Respondent must remit to Requestor \$3,068.52 plus applicable accrued interest within 30 days of receiving this order in accordance with 28 TAC §134.130.
