Requestor's Position

We are owed an additional payment of \$269.36 ... At this time we are requesting that this claim paid in accordance with the 2022 Texas Workers Compensation Fee Schedule and Guidelines for Ambulatory Surgical Centers.

Amount in Dispute: \$269.36

Respondent's Position

Review of the audit confirms that CPT code 23585 has a J8 status indicator which means the payment method applied is per Medicare device intensive method per CMS Guidelines.

Reimbursement is 235% of service portion for CPT code 23585 plus device portion (\$ 4251.62 +

\$ 2225.02 device = \$ 6476.64. Facility was not requesting separate reimbursement for implants.

The bill was processed in accordance with ASC Rule 134.402, no additional payment is due.

Findings and Decision

Authority

This medical fee dispute is decided according to Texas Labor Code §413.031 and applicable rules of the Texas Department of Insurance, Division of Workers' Compensation (DWC).

Statutes and Rules

1. 28 Texas Administrative Code §133.307 sets out the procedures for resolving medical fee disputes.
2. 28 TAC §134.402 sets out the fee guidelines for ASC services.

Denial Reasons

The insurance carrier reduced the payment for the disputed services with the following claim adjustment codes:

- CAC-P12-Workers' compensation jurisdictional fee schedule adjustment.
- D25-Approved non-network provider for Workwell. TX Network claimant per rule 1305.153(C).
- 763-Payment was allowed per the device intensive methodology. Line 2=Overpayment on 1st audit of \$401.92, deducted from implant total. Implants per invoice less overpayment of line 2= \$11,527.58.
- 790-This charge was reimbursed in accordance to the Texas medical fee guideline.
- 892-Implants were allowed per Medicare device portion as no signed certification or cost verification was submitted.
- CAC-193-Original payment decision is being maintained. Upon review, it was determined that this claim was processed properly.
- 763-Paid per ASC FG at 235%; implants not applicable or separate reimbursement (w/signed cert) not requested: Rule 134.402(G).
- 891 – Denied in accordance with DWC rules and/or medical fee guidelines including current CPT code descriptions/instructions.

Issues

1. Is Metrocrest Surgery Center entitled to additional reimbursement?

Findings

1. The requestor is seeking medical fee dispute resolution in the amount of \$269.36 for ASC services rendered on February 25, 2022.

The respondent contends that additional reimbursement is not due because payment of \$6,476.64 was made per the fee guideline.

The fee guidelines for the disputed services are found in 28 TAC §134.402.

- A. Per Addendum AA, CPT codes 23585 is a device intensive procedure.

28 TAC §134.402 (f)(2)(A)(i)(ii) states,

The reimbursement calculation used for establishing the MAR shall be the Medicare ASC reimbursement amount determined by applying the most recently adopted and effective Medicare Payment System Policies for Services Furnished in Ambulatory Surgical Centers and Outpatient Prospective Payment System reimbursement formula and factors as published annually in the *Federal Register*. Reimbursement shall be based on the fully implemented payment amount as in ADDENDUM AA, ASC COVERED SURGICAL PROCEDURES FOR CY 2008, published in the November 27, 2007 publication of the *Federal Register*, or its successor. The following minimal modifications apply: (2) Reimbursement for device intensive procedures shall be: (A) the sum of: (i) the ASC device portion; and (ii) the ASC service portion multiplied by 235 percent."

The following formula was used to calculate the MAR:

- Step 1 calculating the device portion of the procedure:

The national reimbursement is found in the Addendum B for National Hospital Outpatient Prospective Payment System (OPPS) code 23585 for CY 2022 = \$6,397.05.

The device dependent APC offset percentage for National Hospital OPPS found in Addendum P for code 23585 for CY 2022 is 33.19%

Multiply these two = **\$2,123.18**.

- Step 2 calculating the service portion of the procedure:

Per Addendum AA, the Medicare ASC reimbursement rate for code 23585 for CY 2022 is \$6,397.05.

This number is divided by 2 = \$3,198.75.

This number multiplied by the City Wage Index for Carrollton, Texas of 0.9699 = \$3,102.47.

The sum of these two is the geographically adjusted Medicare ASC reimbursement = \$6,301.22.

The service portion is found by taking the geographically adjusted rate minus the device portion = \$4,178.04.

Multiply the service portion by the DWC payment adjustment of 235% = **\$9,818.39**.

- Step 3 calculating the MAR:

The MAR is determined by adding the sum of the reimbursement for the device portion and the service portion = **\$11,941.57**.

DWC finds the MAR for CPT code 23585 is \$11,941.57. Texas Mutual Insurance Company paid \$6,476.54. Metrocrest Surgery Center is seeking \$269.36. This amount is recommended.

Conclusion

The outcome of this medical fee dispute is based on the evidence presented by the requestor and the respondent at the time of adjudication. Though all evidence may not have been discussed, it was considered.

DWC finds the requester has established that additional reimbursement of \$269.36 is due.

Order

Under Texas Labor Code §§413.031 and 413.019, DWC has determined the requestor is entitled to additional reimbursement for the disputed services. It is ordered that Texas Mutual Insurance Company must remit to Metrocrest Surgery Center \$269.36 plus applicable accrued interest within 30 days of receiving this order in accordance with 28 TAC §134.130.

Either party to this medical fee dispute has a right to seek review of this decision under 28 TAC §133.307, which applies to disputes filed on or after **June 1, 2012**.

A party seeking review must submit DWC Form-045M, *Request to Schedule, Reschedule, or Cancel a Benefit Review Conference to Appeal a Medical Fee Dispute Decision (BRC-MFD)* and follow the instructions on the form. You can find the form at www.tdi.texas.gov/forms/form20numeric.html. DWC must receive the request within **20 days** of when you receive this decision. You may fax, mail, or personally deliver your request to DWC using the contact information on the form or the field office handling the claim. The party seeking review of the MFDR decision must deliver a copy of the request to all other
