Requestor's Position

The original claim was paid on <u>09/30/2022</u> on document control number <u>0002525394</u>. Then on <u>10/13/2022</u>, document control number <u>0002527874</u> on the explanation of benefits states that the payment has now been **REVERSED**.

Amount in Dispute: \$154.79

Respondent's Position

The Austin carrier representative for American Casualty Co. of Reading PA is Continental Casualty Co. The representative was notified of this medical fee dispute on October 25, 2022.

Per 28 Texas Administrative Code §133.307 (d)(1), if the DWC does not receive the response within 14 calendar days of the dispute notification, then the DWC may base its decision on the available information.

As of today, no response has been received from the insurance carrier or its representative.

We will base this decision on the information available.

Findings and Decision

<u>Authority</u>

This medical fee dispute is decided according to Texas Labor Code §413.031 and applicable rules of the Texas Department of Insurance, Division of Workers' Compensation (DWC).

Statutes and Rules

- 1. 28 Texas Administrative Code §133.240 sets out the procedures for payment or denial of a medical bill.
- 2. 28 TAC §133.260 sets out the procedures for requesting refunds from health care providers.
- 3. 28 TAC §133.307 sets out the procedures for resolving medical fee disputes.
- 4. 28 TAC §134.503 sets out the fee guidelines for pharmaceutical services.

Denial Reasons

No explanations of benefits defining amount of payment or denial of payment for the drug in question were submitted.

Issues

1. Is Memorial Compounding Rx (Memorial) entitled to reimbursement for the service for the drugs in question?

Findings

1. Memorial is seeking reimbursement for Tramadol and Gabapentin dispensed on August 3, 2022. Memorial argued that the insurance carrier paid for the drugs on September 30, 2022, and then reversed payment on October 13, 2022.

The greater weight of evidence presented to DWC supports that payment was accepted for Tramadol on September 30, 2022, and for Gabapentin on October 6, 2022, then reversed for both on October 13, 2022.

No codes were provided to support a denial of payment for the drugs in dispute. Based on the documentation provided, the DWC finds that there is insufficient evidence that the insurance carrier reimbursed the drugs in question, provided a reason for denial as required by 28 TAC §133.240 (f), or requested a refund for services paid I accordance with 28 TAC §133.260.

Because the insurance carrier failed to sufficiently support a denial of reimbursement or that the bill was paid, DWC finds that Memorial is entitled to reimbursement. The reimbursement considered in this dispute is calculated according to 28 TAC §134.503 (c).

- Tramadol HCl 50 mg Tablets: (0.79615 x 30 x 1.25) + \$4.00 = \$33.86
- Gabapentin 100 mg Capsules: (0.53 x 30 x 1.25) + \$4.00 = \$23.88

The total allowable reimbursement for the drugs in question is \$57.74. This amount is recommended.

Conclusion

The outcome of this medical fee dispute is based on the evidence presented by the requestor and the respondent at the time of adjudication. Though all evidence may not have been discussed, it was considered.

DWC finds the requester has established that additional reimbursement of \$57.74 is due.

Order

Under Texas Labor Code §§413.031 and 413.019, DWC has determined the requestor is entitled to additional reimbursement for the disputed services. It is ordered that American Casualty Co. of Reading PA must remit to Memorial Compounding Rx \$57.74 plus applicable accrued interest within 30 days of receiving this order in accordance with 28 TAC §134.130.
