Requestor's Position

After reviewing the explanation of benefits it indicates that alternate vendor, TMESYS paid \$40.19 and not the full amount of \$406.57.

Amount in Dispute: \$320.12

Respondent's Position

The Austin carrier representative for Arch Indemnity Insurance Co. is Flahive, Ogden & Latson. The representative was notified of this medical fee dispute on November 8, 2022.

Per 28 Texas Administrative Code §133.307 (d)(1), if the DWC does not receive the response within 14 calendar days of the dispute notification, then the DWC may base its decision on the available information.

As of today, no response has been received from the insurance carrier or its representative. We will base this decision on the information available.

Findings and Decision

<u>Authority</u>

This medical fee dispute is decided according to Texas Labor Code §413.031 and applicable rules of the Texas Department of Insurance, Division of Workers' Compensation (DWC).

Statutes and Rules

- 1. 28 Texas Administrative Code §133.240 sets out the procedures for payment or denial of a medical bill.
- 2. 28 TAC §133.307 sets out the procedures for resolving medical fee disputes.
- 3. 28 TAC §134.503 sets out the fee guidelines for pharmaceutical services.

Denial Reasons

Neither party submitted an explanation of benefits with reasons for the denial of payment for the disputed services.

Issues

- 1. Did Arch Indemnity Insurance Co. take final action on the bill for the disputed service before medical fee dispute resolution was requested?
- 2. Is Memorial Compounding Rx (Memorial) entitled to additional reimbursement?

Findings

1. Memorial is seeking reimbursement for Tramadol HCl and Omeprazole DR dispensed on September 9, 2022.

Per 28 TAC §133.240 (a), the insurance carrier is required to take final action by paying, reducing, or denying the service in question not later than 45 days after receiving the medical bill. This deadline is not extended by a request for additional information.

The greater weight of evidence presented to DWC supports that a complete bill for the services in question was received by the insurance carrier or its agent. No evidence was provided to support that the insurance carrier took final action on the bill for the service in question.

2. Because the insurance carrier failed to provide any defense of non-payment for the drugs in question, DWC finds that Memorial is entitled to reimbursement.

The reimbursement considered in this dispute is calculated according to 28 TAC §134.503 (c).

- Tramadol HCl 50 mg tablets: (0.79615 x 90 x 1.25) + \$4.00 = \$93.57
- Omeprazole DR 20 mg capsules: $(0.14400 \times 30 \times 1.25) + $4.00 = 9.40

The total allowable reimbursement is \$102.97. This amount is recommended.

Conclusion

The outcome of this medical fee dispute is based on the evidence presented by the requestor and the respondent at the time of adjudication. Though all evidence may not have been discussed, it was considered.

DWC finds the requester has established that additional reimbursement of \$102.97 is due.

Order

Under Texas Labor Code §§413.031 and 413.019, DWC has determined the requestor is entitled to additional reimbursement for the disputed services. It is ordered that Arch Indemnity Insurance Co. must remit to Memorial Compounding Rx \$102.97 plus applicable accrued interest within 30 days of receiving this order in accordance with 28 TAC §134.130.
