Requestor's Position

"According to Texas Medical Fee Guidelines, the CPT code 96158/96159 considers psychological interventions as necessary to address non-compliance with the treatment plan, and/or the psychological, behavioral, emotional, cognitive, or social factors associated with a newly diagnosed medical condition or an exacerbation of an established medical condition when such factors affect symptom management and expression and health promoting behaviors. Further, the Health and Behavior Intervention (96158/96159) is described as an individual session that does not require pre-authorization."

Amount in Dispute: \$430.00

Respondent's Position

"As the disputed services are psychological services, covered by Rule 134.600(p)(7), they required preauthorization prior to providing those services. Neither the Provider nor anyone acting on their behalf obtained preauthorization. As preauthorization was not obtained for the disputed services, the Provider is not entitled to reimbursement."

<u>Authority</u>

This medical fee dispute is decided according to Texas Labor Code §413.031 and applicable rules of the Texas Department of Insurance, Division of Workers' Compensation (DWC).

Statutes and Rules

- 1. 28 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §133.307 sets out the procedures for resolving medical fee disputes.
- 2. 28 TAC §134.600 sets out the guidelines for preauthorization, concurrent review, and voluntary certification of healthcare.
- 3. 28 TAC §134.203 sets out the fee guidelines for the reimbursement of workers' compensation professional medical services provided on or after March 1, 2008.

Denial Reasons

The insurance carrier reduced or denied the payment for the disputed services with the following claim adjustment codes:

- 242 Services not provided by network/primary care providers.
- W3 Bill is a reconsideration or appeal.
- 5682 Pre-authorization was not obtained prior to the service/procedure being rendered.
- 2005 No additional reimbursement allowed after review of appeal/reconsideration.
- NTWK Priced using Coventry owned contract.

<u>lssues</u>

- 1. Are the disputed services subject to preauthorization in accordance with 28 TAC §134.600?
- 2. What rule applies to the billing and reimbursement of the disputed services?
- 3. Is the requestor entitled to reimbursement?

<u>Findings</u>

1. The requestor seeks reimbursement for CPT Codes 96158 and 96159 rendered on April 7, 2022 and April 14, 2022.

28 TAC §134.203 (b) states in pertinent part, "For coding, billing, reporting, and reimbursement of professional medical services, Texas workers' compensation system participants shall apply the following: (1) Medicare payment policies, including its coding; billing; correct coding initiatives (CCI) edits; modifiers; bonus payments for health professional shortage areas (HPSAs) and physician scarcity areas (PSAs); and other payment policies in effect on the date a service is provided with any additions or exceptions in the rules."

- CPT Code 96158 is defined as "Health behavior intervention, individual, face-to-face; initial 30 minutes."
- CPT Code 96159 is defined as "Health behavior intervention, individual, face-to-face; each additional 15 minutes."
- The disputed services are considered health and behavior assessment and intervention services.

28 TAC §134.600 (p) (7) states in pertinent part "(p) Non-emergency health care requiring preauthorization includes: (7) all psychological testing and psychotherapy, repeat interviews, and biofeedback, except when any service is part of a preauthorized return-to-work rehabilitation program..."

The DWC finds that CPT Codes 96158 and 96159 do not require preauthorization per 28 TAC §134.600 (p)(7). As a result, reimbursement is determined per 28 TAC §134.203.

2. 28 TAC §134.203 (c) states in pertinent part, "To determine the MAR for professional services, system participants shall apply the Medicare payment policies with minimal modifications. (1) For service categories of Evaluation & Management, General Medicine, Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, Radiology, Pathology, Anesthesia, and Surgery when performed in an office setting, the established conversion factor to be applied is \$52.83. For Surgery when performed in a facility setting, the established conversion factor to be applied is \$66.32. (2) The conversion factors listed in paragraph (1) of this subsection shall be the conversion factors for calendar year 2008. Subsequent year's conversion factors shall be determined by applying the annual percentage adjustment of the Medicare Economic Index (MEI) to the previous year's conversion factors, and shall be effective January 1st of the new calendar year..."

To determine the MAR the following formula is used: (DWC Conversion Factor/Medicare Conversion Factor) X Medicare Payment = Maximum Allowable Reimbursement (MAR).

- The 2022 DWC Conversion Factor is 62.46
- The 2022 Medicare Conversion Factor is 34.6062
- Per the medical bills, the services were rendered in zip code 78230; therefore, the Medicare locality is "Rest of Texas."

The Medicare Participating amount for CPT code 96158 x 1 unit at this locality is \$65.47.

- Using the above formula, the DWC finds the MAR is \$118.17 x 2 dates of service = total MAR of \$236.34.
- The respondent paid \$0.00.
- Reimbursement of \$236.34 is recommended.

The Medicare Participating amount for CPT code 96159 x 2 units at this locality is 22.33×2 units = 44.66.

- Using the above formula, the DWC finds the MAR is \$80.61 x 2 dates of service = total MAR of \$161.22.
- The respondent paid \$0.00.
- Reimbursement of \$161.22 is recommended.
- 3. The DWC finds that the requestor has established that reimbursement is due. As a result, the requestor is entitled to \$397.56 for the disputed services.

Conclusion

The outcome of this medical fee dispute is based on the evidence presented by the requestor and the respondent at the time of adjudication. Though all evidence may not have been discussed, it was considered.

The DWC finds the requester has established that reimbursement of \$397.56 is due.

Order

Under Texas Labor Code §§413.031 and 413.019, DWC has determined the requestor is entitled to reimbursement for the disputed services. It is ordered that the Respondent must remit to the Requestor \$397.56 plus applicable accrued interest within 30 days of receiving this order in accordance with 28 TAC §134.130.
