Requestor's Position

The requestor did not submit a position statement with this request for MFDR. They did submit a document titled "Reconsideration" dated June 9, 2023. Request for reconsideration must be sent to the applicable worker's compensation carrier not Texas Department of Insurance (TDI). This document states, "Per EOB received bill denied due to timely filing. Please note that bill was submitted to Hanover Insurance prior to billing Zenith Insurance, and proof of timely filing enclosed for review."

Amount in Dispute: \$24,201.16

Respondent's Position

"Zenith's review and findings for dates of service 10/26/2022 – 11/04/2022: The bill in dispute was originally filed to Hanover Insurance ('Hanover'). Hanover filed a Notice of Denial of Compensability/Liability and Refusal to Pay Benefits on May 4, 2022 (Notice attached with MFDR), advising that the claim was denied because it was reported to them in error. Baylor was required to submit the medical bill within 95 days from the date of notification. The 95th day from 05/04/2022 was 8/07/2022. Zenith received the original bill submission on 02/28/2023 (Exhibit #1). Therefore, the original denial should stand."

Findings and Decision

<u>Authority</u>

This medical fee dispute is decided according to <u>Texas Labor Code §413.031</u> and applicable rules of the Texas Department of Insurance, Division of Workers' Compensation (DWC).

Statues and Rules

- 1. <u>28 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §133.307</u> sets out the procedures for resolving medical fee disputes.
- 2. <u>28 TAC §134.20</u> sets out requirements of medical bill submission.
- 3. <u>Texas Labor Code 408.0272</u> sets out the workers compensation timely billing and exceptions guidelines.

Denial Reasons

The insurance carrier denied the disputed services with the following claim adjustment codes.

- 29 The time limit for filing has expired.
- 200 Per 133.20, a medical bill shall not be submitted later than the 1st day of the 11th month (<08-31-05) or 95 days (>09/01/05) after DOS.

<u>lssues</u>

- 1. What documents were submitted for review?
- 2. Did the requestor support timely submission of medical claim?

Findings

- 1. The requestor included the following documents with their request for review.
 - PLN-1 dated May 4, 2022 stating claim was submitted to wrong carrier. The date of service in dispute is November 4, 2022. The disputed date of service is after the date of notification. The requestor's statement, "bill was submitted to Hanover Insurance prior to billing Zenith Insurance" is not supported.
 - Explanation of benefits that indicates claim was received February 28, 2023. This date is past the 95-day filing deadline.
 - Explanation of benefits that indicates claim was received April 17, 2023. This date is past the 95-day filing deadline.
- 2. The requestor is seeking reimbursement for outpatient hospital services rendered in November of 2022. The insurance carrier states a claim was not received. The following two rules apply to receipt of medical bills.

DWC Rule 28 TAC §102.4 (h) Unless the great weight of evidence indicates otherwise, written communications will be deemed to have been sent on:

(1) the date received if sent by fax, personal delivery, or electronic transmission; or

(2) the date postmarked if sent by mail through United States Postal Service regular mail, or, if the postmark date is unavailable, the later of the signature date on the written communication or the date it was received minus five days. If the date received minus five days is a Sunday or legal holiday, the date deemed sent must be the next previous day that is not a Sunday or legal holiday.

DWC Rule 28 TAC §133.20 (b) states in pertinent part,

(b) Except as provided in Labor Code §408.0272(b), (c) or (d), a health care provider shall not submit a medical bill later than the 95th day after the date the services are provided.

Texas Labor Code 408.0272. (b) states in pertinent part,

(b) Notwithstanding Section 408.0272, a health care provider who fails to timely submit a claim for payment to the insurance carrier under Section 408.0272(a) does not forfeit the provider's right to reimbursement for that claim for payment solely for failure to submit a timely claim if:

(1) the provider submits proof satisfactory to the commissioner that the provider, within the period prescribed by Section 408.027(a), erroneously filed for reimbursement with:

(A) an insurer that issues a policy of group accident and health insurance under which the injured employee is a covered insured;

(B) a health maintenance organization that issues evidence of coverage under which the injured employee is a covered enrollee; or

(C) a workers' compensation insurance carrier other than the insurance carrier liable for the payment of benefits under this title;

(2) the commissioner determines that the failure resulted from a catastrophic event that substantially interfered with the normal business operations of the provider.

Review of the submitted documentation found insufficient information to support the respondent's statement that the claim was filed timely after notification of the correct worker's compensation carrier.

No payment is recommended.

<u>Conclusion</u>

The outcome of this medical fee dispute is based on the evidence presented by the requestor and the respondent at the time of adjudication. Though all evidence may not have been discussed, it was considered.

DWC finds the requester has not established that reimbursement is due.

Order

Under Texas Labor Code §§413.031 and 413.019, DWC has determined the requestor is entitled to \$0.00 reimbursement for the disputed services.
