#### PART V: MEDICAL DISPUTE RESOLUTION REVIEW SUMMARY, METHODOLOGY, AND/OR EXPLANATION

Under the provisions of Section 413.031 of the Texas Workers' Compensation Act, Title 5, Subtitle A of the Texas Labor Code and Division Rule 133.308 (relating to Medical Dispute Resolution by Independent Review Organization), Medical Dispute Resolution assigned an Independent Review Organization (IRO) to conduct a review of the medical necessity issues between the Requestor and Respondent.

The Division has reviewed the enclosed IRO decision and determined that the Requestor did prevail on the disputed medical necessity issues. The amount due the Requestor for the items denied for medical necessity is \$882.00.

IRO America Inc. (IRO America) has been certified by the Texas Department of Insurance as an Independent Review Organization. The TDI, Division of Workers' Compensation (DWC) has assigned this case to IRO America for independent review in accordance with DWC Rule 133.308 which allows for medical dispute resolution by an IRO.

IRO America has performed an independent review of the proposed care to determine if the adverse determination was appropriate. In performing this review, all relevant medical records and documentation utilized to make the adverse determination, along with any documentation and written information submitted, was reviewed.

The independent review was performed by a matched peer with the treating doctor; the Reviewer is a credentialed Panel Member of IRO America's Medical Knowledge Panel who is a licensed MD, board certified and specialized in Pain Management.

The reviewer is on the DWC Approved Doctor List (ADL).

The IRO America Panel Member/Reviewer is a health care professional who has signed a certification statement stating that no known conflicts of interest exist between the Reviewer and the injured employee, the injured employee's employer, the injured employee's insurance carrier, the utilization review agent, or any of the treating doctors or insurance carriers health care providers who reviewed the case for decision before referral to IRO America for independent review. In addition, the reviewer has certified that the review was performed without bias for or against any party to the dispute.

#### **RECORDS REVIEWED**

Notification of IRO Assignment, records from the Requestor, Respondent, and Treating Doctor(s), including but not limited to: Records from Bayou City Pain Consultants for the dates 11/3005 through 1/4/06, Records from the office of Elias Benhamou.

#### **CLINICAL HISTORY**

Ms. . is a 40 year-old female who was injured on the job in . She injured her lower back while on the job. She was seen by a neurosurgeon requested diagnostic blocks.

#### **DISPUTED SERVICE(S)**

Under dispute is the retrospective medical necessity of anesthesia procedure--anesthesia for diagnostic or therapeutic nerve blocks and injections (when block or injections is performed by a different provider) prone position on 11/30/05, 12/14/05, and 1/4/06.

#### **DETERMINATION/DECISION**

The Reviewer disagrees with the determination of the insurance company.

#### **RATIONALE/BASIS FOR THE DECISION**

Diagnostic blocks performed around the spinal cord require The Patient to be quite still so that the needles do not damage the spinal cord. The purpose of the anesthesia is to sedate the patient so that they don't move while the needles are inserted around spinal cord for the diagnostic block. Therefore, The Reviewer's medical assessment is that the anesthesia was medically necessary.

#### **Screening Criteria**

General:

In making his determination, the Reviewer had reviewed medically acceptable screening criteria relevant to the case, which may include but is not limited to any of the following: Evidence Based Medicine Guidelines (Helsinki, Finland); Texas Medical Foundation: Screening Criteria Manual (Austin, Texas); Texas Chiropractic Association: Texas Guidelines to Quality Assurance (Austin Texas); Texas Medical Foundation: Screening Criteria Manual (Austin, Texas); Mercy Center Guidelines of Quality Assurance; any and all guidelines issued by DWC or other State of Texas Agencies; standards contained in Medicare Coverage Database; ACOEM Guidelines; peer-reviewed literate and scientific studies that meet nationally recognized standards; standard references compendia; and findings; studies conducted under the auspices of federal government agencies and research institutes; the findings of any national board recognized by the National Institutes of Health; peer reviewed abstracts submitted for presentation at major medical associates meetings; any other recognized authorities and systems of evaluation that are relevant.

#### **CERTIFICATION BY OFFICER**

IRO America has performed an independent review solely to determine the medical necessity of the health services that are the subject of the review. IRO America has made no determinations regarding benefits available under the injured employee's policy.

### Your Right To Appeal

If you are unhappy with all or part of this decision, you have the right to appeal the decision. The decision of the Independent Review Organization is binding during the appeal process.

If you are disputing the decision (other than a spinal surgery prospective decision), the appeal must be made directly to a district court in Travis County (see Texas Labor Code §413.031). An appeal to District Court must be filed not later than 30 days after the date on which the decision that is the subject of the appeal is final and appealable. If you are disputing a spinal surgery prospective decision, a request for a hearing must be in writing and it must be received by the Division of Workers' Compensation, Chief Clerk of Proceedings, within ten (10) days of your receipt of this decision.

The party appealing this decision shall deliver a copy of its written request for a hearing to other party involved in this dispute.
