___ has been certified by the Texas Department of Insurance as an Independent Review Organization. The Texas Worker's Compensation Commission has assigned this case to ___ for independent review in accordance with TWCC Rule 133.308 which allows for medical dispute resolution by an IRO.

___ has performed an independent review of the proposed care to determine if the adverse determination was appropriate. In performing this review, all relevant medical records and documentation utilized to make the adverse determination, along with any documentation and written information submitted, was reviewed.

The independent review was performed by a matched peer with the treating doctor. This case was reviewed by a licensed Medical Doctor with a specialty and board certification in Orthopedic Surgery. The ___ health care professional has signed a certification statement stating that no known conflicts of interest exist between the reviewer and any of the treating doctors or providers or any of the doctors or providers who reviewed the case for a determination prior to the referral to ___ for independent review. In addition, the reviewer has certified that the review was performed without bias for or against any party to the dispute.

CLINICAL HISTORY

___ is a 45-year-old woman who injured her lower back on ___. At the time, she was employed as an assistant at ___. On the day of injury, records indicate that she was moving a patient back to a wheelchair when she developed low back pain.

___ initially had a lower back pain radiating to her legs on the right greater than the left. She has had an MRI of the lumbar spine that demonstrated prominent disc dessication at L4/5 and L5/S1 with a possible mild annular protrusion at those two levels. There is facet joint arthrosis at L5/S1.

___ has completed an extensive course of conservative treatment to include physical therapy and has also undergone several epidural steroid injections that provided only temporary relief. She has also been evaluated by a urologist for possible urinary incontinence, but this was found to be unrelated to her lower back problems.

This patient has ongoing lower back pain. ___ would like to evaluate ___ with a lumbar discogram with a CT scan to determine what level might be her pain generator in order to do an IDET procedure.

REQUESTED SERVICE

A lumbar discogram with CT Scan is requested for this patient.

DECISION

The reviewer disagrees with the prior adverse determination.

BASIS FOR THE DECISION

___ has completed an extensive course of conservative treatment to include physical therapy and has also undergone several epidural steroid injections that provided only temporary relief.

Based on the medical records provided for review, the reviewer finds that the proposed lumbar discogram with CT scan would be a reasonable and medical necessity to help evaluate this patient’s ongoing low back pain.

___ has performed an independent review solely to determine the medical necessity of the health services that are the subject of the review. ___ has made no determinations regarding benefits available under the injured employee’s policy.

As an officer of ___, I certify that there is no known conflict between the reviewer, ___ and/or any officer/employee of the IRO with any person or entity that is a party to the dispute.

___ is forwarding by mail and, in the case of time sensitive matters by facsimile, a copy of this finding to the treating doctor, payor and/or URA, patient and the TWCC.

YOUR RIGHT TO REQUEST A HEARING

Either party to this medical dispute may disagree with all or part of the decision and has a right to request a hearing.

In the case of prospective *spinal surgery* decision, a request for a hearing must be made in writing and it must be received by the TWCC Chief Clerk of Proceedings within 10 days of your receipt of this decision. (20 Tex. Admin. Code 142.5(c)).

In the case of other *prospective (preauthorization) medical necessity* disputes a request for a hearing must be in writing, and it must be received by the TWCC Chief Clerk of Proceedings within **20** (twenty) days of your receipt of this decision (28 Tex. Admin. Code 148.3).

This decision is deemed received by you 5 (five) days after it was mailed (28 Tex. Admin. Code 102.4(h) or 102.5(d)). A request for a hearing should be sent to: Chief Clerk of Proceedings, Texas Worker’s Compensation Commission, P.O. Box 40669, Austin, TX 78704-0012. A copy of this decision should be attached to the request.

The party appealing this decision shall deliver a copy of its written request for a hearing to all other parties involved in the dispute, per TWCC rule 133.308(t)(2).
