

## NOTICE OF INDEPENDENT REVIEW DETERMINATION

An independent review of the above-referenced case has been completed by a medical physician board certified in family practice. ### CLINICAL HISTORY

This patient sustained a workers' compensation injury on \_\_\_\_. She was treated with medications, multiple surgeries, and a muscle stimulator. A request to purchase a muscle stimulator for indefinite use was denied.

### REQUESTED SERVICE(S)

Purchase of an interferential muscle stimulator.

### DECISION

Deny request.

### RATIONALE/BASIS FOR DECISION

All records submitted were thoroughly reviewed. Although there is a paucity of records considering the date of the original injury, sufficient information can be derived to base this decision. Muscle stimulators are to be used as an adjunctive therapy in the acute phase of treatment. This view is the standard of care and

supported by accepted guidelines including N.A.S.S., CMS, and the Philadelphia Panel Study. No peer reviewed literature or generally accepted guidelines recommend the use of the muscle stimulators in the treatment of chronic, low back pain patients who are post-surgical. Therefore, no medical necessity can be justified for this patient purchasing the device, so the original denial is upheld.

### **YOUR RIGHT TO REQUEST A HEARING**

Either party to this medical dispute may disagree with all or part of the decision and has a right to request a hearing.

**If disputing a spinal surgery prospective decision** a request for a hearing must be in writing, and it must be received by the TWCC Chief Clerk of Proceedings within **10** (ten) calendar days of your receipt of this decision (20 Tex. Admin. Code 142.5©).

**If disputing other prospective medical necessity (preauthorization) decisions** a request for a hearing must be in writing, and it must be received by the TWCC Chief Clerk of Proceedings within **20** (twenty) calendar days of your receipt of this decision (28 Tex. Admin. Code 148.3).

This decision is deemed received by you 5 (five) days after it was mailed or the date of fax (28 Tex. Admin. Code 102.4(h) or 102.5(d)). A request for a hearing and a **copy of this decision** must be sent to:
