NOTICE OF INDEPENDENT REVIEW DECISION

February 6, 2004

Re: IRO Case # M2-04-0618

Texas Worker's Compensation Commission:

___ has been certified as an independent review organization (IRO) and has been authorized to perform independent reviews of medical necessity for the Texas Worker's Compensation Commission (TWCC). Texas HB. 2600, Rule133.308 effective January 1, 2002, allows a claimant or provider who has received an adverse medical necessity determination from a carrier's internal process, to request an independent review by an IRO.

In accordance with the requirement that TWCC assign cases to certified IROs, TWCC assigned this case to ___ for an independent review. ___ has performed an independent review of the proposed care to determine if the adverse determination was appropriate. For that purpose, ___ received relevant medical records, any documents obtained from parties in making the adverse determination, and any other documents and/or written information submitted in support of the appeal.

The case was reviewed by a physician who is Board Certified in Neurological Surgery, and who has met the requirements for the TWCC Approved Doctor List or who has been granted an exception from the ADL. He or she has signed a certification statement attesting that no known conflicts of interest exist between him or her and any of the treating physicians or providers, or any of the physicians or providers who reviewed the case for a determination prior to referral to ___ for independent review. In addition, the certification statement further attests that the review was performed without bias for or against the carrier, medical provider, or any other party to this case.

The determination of the ___ reviewer who reviewed this case, based on the medical records provided, is as follows:

History

The patient is a 51-year-old male who developed lumbar pain in ___ while picking up a motor. The injury was apparently made worse by a fall from a ladder. In which the patient struck his lumbar region. He was treated with physical therapy and injections without benefit. In 1999 surgery was performed at L4-5 and L5-S1 including lumbar fusion and placement of pedicle screws. The patient improved.

Starting especially in 2003, the patient developed back pain with some lower extremity discomfort, and this has persisted. A 9/3/03 CT scan showed a good fusion with no pseudoarthrosis or any complication from the surgery. The one complication that could probably be expected is some adhesions, which may contribute to lumbar spine and lower extremity discomfort.

Requested Service(s)

Lumbar transforaminal epidural steroid injection with catheter with lysis of adhesions at bilateral L4, L5, S1

Decision

I disagree with the carrier's decision to deny the requested treatment.

Rationale

X-rays showed a solid fusion, and another open procedure is not thought indicated. The changes in the patient's lumbar spine causing discomfort are not unusual, and the procedure recommended has been beneficial under circumstances such as those of this patient.

This medical necessity decision by an Independent Review Organization is deemed to be a Commission decision and order.

YOUR RIGHT TO REQUEST A HEARING

Either party to medical dispute may disagree with all or part of the decision and has a right to request a hearing.

If disputing a spinal surgery prospective decision, a request for a hearing must be in writing, and it must be received by the TWCC Chief Clerk of Proceedings within **10** (ten) calendar days of your receipt of this decision (28 Tex. Admin. Code 142.5(c)).

If disputing other prospective medical necessity (preauthorization) decisions, a request for a hearing must be in writing, and it must be received by the TWCC Chief Clerk of Proceedings within **20** (twenty) calendar days of your receipt of this decision (28 Tex. Admin. Code 142.5(c)).

This decision is deemed received by you 5 (five) days after it was mailed or the date of fax (28 Tex. Admin. Code 102.5(d)). A request for a hearing and a **copy of this decision** must be sent to:
