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## NOTICE OF INDEPENDENT REVIEW DECISION

The Texas Medical Foundation (TMF) has been certified by the Texas Department of Insurance (TDI) as an independent review organization (IRO). The Texas Workers' Compensation Commission (TWCC) has assigned the above referenced case to TMF for independent review in accordance with TWCC Rule §133.308 which allows for medical dispute resolution by an IRO.

TMF has performed an independent review of the proposed care to determine if the adverse determination was appropriate. In performing this review, relevant medical records, any documents utilized by the parties referenced above in making the adverse determination, and any documentation and written information submitted in support of the appeal was reviewed.

The independent review was performed by a TMF physician reviewer who is board certified in Family Practice, by the American Board of Family Practice, licensed by the Texas State Board of Medical Examiners (TSBME) in 1978, and who provides health care to injured workers. This is the same specialty as the treating physician. The TMF physician reviewer has signed a certification statement stating that no known conflicts of interest exist between him or her and any of the treating physicians or providers or any of the physicians or providers who reviewed the case for a determination prior to the referral to TMF for independent review. In addition, the reviewer has certified that the review was performed without bias for or against any party to this case.

### Clinical History

This 42 year-old female was injured on \_\_\_ while trying to get turned in the correct direction on a kayaking trip (this was a part of her job), she and others in the group linked arms to tow her around correctly. The towing action was jarring and caused her pain in her neck and back. She has been treated with therapy, medication and the RS4i Sequential Stimulator 4-channel combination Interferential and Muscle Stimulator Unit.

### Requested Service(s)

Purchase of an RS4i Sequential Stimulator 4-channel combination Interferential and Muscle Stimulator Unit

### Decision

It is determined that there is no medical necessity for the purchase of an RS4i Sequential Stimulator 4-channel combination Interferential and Muscle Stimulator Unit to treat this patient's medical condition.

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Rationale/Basis for Decision

The RS4i Sequential Stimulator 4-channel combination Interferential and Muscle Stimulator Unit (RS4i) can be beneficial as a treatment for certain patients with neck or back pain. Medical record documentation indicates the electromyogram and magnetic resonance imaging for this patient are within normal limits. She has received treatment for this injury and has been using the RS4i with no improvement of her condition. Therefore, the proposed purchase of the RS4i is not medically necessary to treat this patient's medical condition.

This decision by the IRO is deemed to be a TWCC decision and order.

**YOUR RIGHT TO REQUEST A HEARING**

Either party to this medical dispute may disagree with all or part of the decision and has a right to request a hearing.

**If disputing a spinal surgery prospective decision** a request for a hearing must be in writing and it must be received by the TWCC Chief Clerk of Proceedings within **10** (ten) calendar days of your receipt of this decision (28 Tex. Admin. Code 142.5 (c)).

**If disputing other prospective medical necessity (preauthorization) decisions** a request for a hearing must be in writing, and it must be received by the TWCC Chief Clerk of Proceedings within **20** (twenty) calendar days of your receipt of this decision (28 Tex. Admin. Code 142.5(c)).

This decision is deemed received by you 5 (five) days after it was mailed or the date of fax (28 Tex. Admin. Code 102.5(d)). A request for hearing and a **copy of this decision** must be sent to: Chief Clerk of Proceedings/Appeals Clerk, Texas Workers' Compensation Commission, P.O. Box 17787, Austin, Texas, 78744, Fax: 512-804-4011.

The party appealing this decision shall deliver a copy of its written request for a hearing to all other parties involved in this dispute.
