The Texas Medical Foundation (TMF) has been certified by the Texas Department of Insurance (TDI) as an independent review organization (IRO). The Texas Workers' Compensation Commission (TWCC) has assigned the above referenced case to TMF for independent review in accordance with TWCC Rule §133.308 which allows for medical dispute resolution by an IRO.

TMF has performed an independent review of the proposed care to determine if the adverse determination was appropriate. In performing this review, relevant medical records, any documents utilized by the parties referenced above in making the adverse determination, and any documentation and written information submitted in support of the appeal was reviewed.

The independent review was performed by a TMF physician reviewer who is board certified in Anesthesiology, by the American Board of Anesthesiology, licensed by the Texas State Board of Medical Examiners (TSBME) in 1997, and who provides health care to injured workers. This is the same specialty as the treating physician. The TMF physician reviewer has signed a certification statement stating that no known conflicts of interest exist between him or her and any of the treating physicians or providers or any of the physicians or providers who reviewed the case for a determination prior to the referral to TMF for independent review. In addition, the reviewer has certified that the review was performed without bias for or against any party to this case.

Clinical History

This 50 year-old male injured his back on ___ while unloading pallets off an airplane. He felt immediate back pain and reported to the company doctor. He was prescribed Vioxx and taken off work. He has also been treated with epidural steroid injections.

Requested Service(s)

Repeat Nerve Conduction Velocity (NCV) of lower extremities

Decision

It is determined that there is medical necessity for the repeat Nerve Conduction Velocity (NCV) of lower extremities to treat this patient's medical condition.

Rationale/Basis for Decision

This patient has had two fusion procedures that resulted in fusions from the level of L3 to the sacrum. Recent radiographic studies indicate failed fusions at multiple levels. The patient has complaints of significant back, hip, and leg pain. A past Electromyogram (EMG) showed an acute S1 radiculopathy several years ago. It is reasonable and necessary to perform an EMG/NCV as part of the work-up to formulate an appropriate treatment plan. Therefore, the repeat Nerve Conduction Velocity (NCV) of lower extremities is medically necessary to treat this patient's medical condition.

This decision by the IRO is deemed to be a TWCC decision and order.

YOUR RIGHT TO REQUEST A HEARING

Either party to this medical dispute may disagree with all or part of the decision and has a right to request a hearing.

If disputing a spinal surgery prospective decision a request for a hearing must be in writing and it must be received by the TWCC Chief Clerk of Proceedings within **10** (ten) calendar days of your receipt of this decision (28 Tex. Admin. Code 142.5 (c)).

If disputing other prospective medical necessity (preauthorization) decisions a request for a hearing must be in writing, and it must be received by the TWCC Chief Clerk of Proceedings within **20** (twenty) calendar days of your receipt of this decision (28 Tex. Admin. Code 142.5(c)).

This decision is deemed received by you 5 (five) days after it was mailed or the date of fax (28 Tex. Admin. Code 102.5(d)). A request for hearing and a **copy of this decision** must be sent to: Chief Clerk of Proceedings/Appeals Clerk, Texas Workers' Compensation Commission, P.O. Box 17787, Austin, Texas, 78744, Fax: 512-804-4011.

The party appealing this decision shall deliver a copy of its written request for a hearing to all other parties involved in this dispute.
