The findings of the independent review are as follows:

Questions for Review

Medical necessity of Lumbar discogram @ L3-4, L4-5 and L5-S1

Determination

PHMO, Inc. has performed an independent review of the proposed care to determine if the adverse determination was appropriate. After review of all medical records received from both parties involved, the PHMO, Inc. physician reviewer has determined to **uphold the denial** on the requested service(s).

Summary of Clinical History

Ms. ____ sustained a work related job injury on ____, while employed with _____.

Clinical Rationale

This patient per Dr. Rosenstein has lumbar radiculopathy with an absent right patella and right ankle reflex. The lumbar MRI of 11/9/03 showed disc dessication and degenerative changes at L3-4, L4-5, and L5-S1 including facet hypertrophy at all three levels. She has lost considerable weight, over 200 pound, but is still apparently weighing over 200 pounds per the 1/3/06 office note.

The use of discography would be predicated on its potential use to identify the "pain generator" and subsequent use of a fusion surgery at the pain generator level. She has three levels of disc abnormality.

Any fusion surgery will transfer stress to adjacent disc levels, which are already abnormal. Moreover, there is a prospective study that clearly showed the failure of discography to locate the pain generator. Thus, the proposed discogram is not validated as a medical necessity.

Clinical Criteria, Utilization Guidelines or other material referenced

- Carragee et al. *Spine*, several articles in 1999-2000.

The reviewer for this case is a Medical Doctor licensed by the Texas State Board of Medical Examiners. The reviewer is a diplomate of the American Board of Orthopedic Surgery, and is engaged in the full time practice of medicine.

The review was performed in accordance with Texas Insurance Code 21.58C and the rules of Texas Department of Insurance /Division of Workers' Compensation. In accordance with the act and the rules, the review is listed on the DWC's list of approved providers or has a temporary exemption. The review includes the determination and the clinical rationale to support the determination. Specific utilization review criteria or other treatment guidelines used in this review are referenced.

The reviewer signed a certification attesting that no known conflicts-of-interest exist between the reviewer and the treating and/or referring provider, the injured employee, the injured employee's employer, the injured employee's insurance carrier, the utilization review agent, or any of the treating doctors or insurance carrier health care providers who reviewed the case for decision before referral to the IRO. The reviewer also attests that the review was performed without any bias for or against the patient, carrier, or other parties associated with this case.

Your Right To Appeal

If you are unhappy with all or part of this decision, you have the right to appeal the decision. The decision of the Independent Review Organization is binding during the appeal process.

If you are disputing the decision (other than a spinal surgery prospective decision), the appeal must be made directly to a district court in Travis County (see Texas Labor Code §413.031). An appeal to District Court must be filed not later than 30 days after the date on which the decision that is the subject of the appeal is final and appealable.

If you are disputing a spinal surgery prospective decision, a request for a hearing must be in writing and it must be received by the Division of Workers' Compensation, Chief Clerk of Proceedings, within ten (10) days of your receipt of this decision.
