

Lori B. Wasserburger, M.D.

Dr. Lori B. Wasserburger received her undergraduate degree in Zoology at the University of Wisconsin - Madison in 1979. She received additional education in biochemistry and life sciences at UW and started a post-graduate degree program at the University of Texas - Austin in Exercise Physiology and Kinesiology in 1981. She received her medical degree (1986) and completed residency training in Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation (1990), at The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio, where she was Chief Resident.

Dr. Wasserburger is Board Certified in Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation (1991) and Neuromuscular and Electrodiagnostic Medicine (1992). She maintains an active practice in Austin, Texas. Dr. Wasserburger was a Board Member of the Physiatric Association of Sports, Spine & Rehabilitation (PASSOR) from 1995-2000. She coauthored textbook chapters on The Biomechanics of Rehabilitation of Football Injuries, The Biomechanics and Rehabilitation of Water-Skiing Injuries, Upper Extremity Soft Tissue Injuries, Head and Neck Injuries in Sport, Lumbar Spine Injuries in Sport and Psychological Factors Affecting Soft Tissue Injury. Dr. Wasserburger has served as an expert witness in County to Federal Court cases since 1991. She serves as an expert for liability cases, medical malpractice and formulates Life Care Plans for catastrophically injured individuals.

Dr. Wasserburger has served as an Impairment Rating / Designated Doctor since 1993. She also conducts Required Medical Examinations, Alternate certifications and similar examinations for her own patients. Dr. Wasserburger is a member of the Medial Quality Review Panel (MQRP) for the Office of the Medical Advisor for the Division of Worker's Compensation (DWC) and has been a Subject Matter Expert for DWC for test development, curriculum and lecturer for the Designated Doctor (DD) Certification / Recertification program since 1993. She is current Designated Doctor Education Advisor.
