REQUESTOR'S POSITION SUMMARY

Requestor's Position Summary: "F-wave studies are a separate and billable service not to be bundled with another nerve study."

Amount in Dispute: \$270.00

RESPONDENT'S POSITION SUMMARY

Respondent's Position Summary: The Division placed a copy of the Medical Fee Dispute Resolution request in the insurance carrier's Austin representative box, which was acknowledged, received on March 21, 2012. The insurance carrier did not submit a response for consideration in this review. Accordingly, this decision is based on the available information.

FINDINGS AND DECISION

This medical fee dispute is decided pursuant to Texas Labor Code §413.031 and applicable rules of the Texas Department of Insurance, Division of Workers' Compensation.

Background

- 28 Texas Administrative Code §133.307 sets out the procedures for resolving medical fee disputes.
- 28 Texas Administrative Code §134.203 sets out the reimbursement guidelines for professional medical services.
- The insurance carrier reduced payment for the disputed services with the following claim adjustment codes:
 - 97 – The benefit for this service is included in the payment/allowance for another service
 - F wave studies are included in the reimbursement for the nerve conduction studies

Issues

1. Are the insurance carrier’s reasons for denial or reduction of payment supported?
2. Is the requestor entitled to additional reimbursement?

Findings

1. The insurance carrier denied disputed services with claim adjustment reason code 97 – “The benefit for this service is included in the payment/allowance for another service.” 28 Texas Administrative Code §134.203(b) states, “For coding, billing, reporting, and reimbursement of professional medical services, Texas workers' compensation system participants shall apply the following: (1) Medicare payment policies, including its coding; billing; correct coding initiatives (CCI) edits; modifiers; “

Review of the National Correct Coding Initiative Policy Manual for Medicare services, Chapter 11 finds, “The NCCI edit with column one CPT code 95903 (Motor nerve conduction studies with F-wave study, each nerve) and column two CPT code 95900 (Motor nerve conduction studies without F-wave study, each nerve) is often bypassed by utilizing modifier 59. Use of modifier 59 with the column two CPT code 95900 of this NCCI edit is appropriate only if the two procedures are performed on different nerves or at separate patient encounters.”

Review of the submitted medical documentation finds the same muscles listed for both the “Motor Summary Table” and “F Wave Studies. The Division finds the insurance carrier’s denial reason is supported.

2. Pursuant to Rule 134.203 (b) no additional reimbursement can be recommended.

Conclusion

For the reasons stated above, the Division finds that the requestor has not established that additional reimbursement is due. As a result, the amount ordered is \$0.00.

ORDER

Based upon the documentation submitted by the parties and in accordance with the provisions of Texas Labor Code §413.031, the Division has determined that the requestor is entitled to \$0.00 reimbursement for the disputed services.
