"Rationale: The service in question was performed on 06/10/2024. The date is more than a year following the in question date(s) of service. Per rule 133.307 ( c ) (1) states: "A request for MFDR that does not involve issues identified in subparagraph ( B ) of this paragraph shall be filed no later than one year after the date(s) of dispute."

The requestor has failed to timely file this dispute with the Division; consequently, the requestor has waived the right to medical fee dispute resolution."

# Findings and Decision

## **Authority**

This medical fee dispute is decided according to [Texas Labor Code \(TLC\) §413.031](#) and applicable rules of the Texas Department of Insurance, Division of Workers' Compensation (DWC).

## **Statutes and Rules**

1. 28 Texas Administrative Code [TAC §133.305](#) sets out the procedures for resolving medical disputes.
2. [28 TAC §133.307](#) sets out the procedures for resolving medical fee disputes.

## **Denial Reasons**

The insurance carrier denied the payment for the disputed services with the following claim adjustment codes:

- 29 – The time limit for filing has expired.
- 0063 – Reimbursement has been calculated based on the state guidelines.
- 4271 – Per TX Labor Code SEC 408.027 Providers must submit bills to payors within 95 days of the date of service
- 90096 – The time limit for filing has expired

## **Issues**

1. Has the Requester waived their right to medical fee dispute resolution?

## **Findings**

1. The Requester seeks payment in the amount of \$521.14, for medical services provided on June 10, 2024.

28 TAC §133.307 (c) (1) states in the pertinent part, "Timeliness. A Requester must timely file the request with the division or waive the right to MFDR. The division will deem a request to be filed on the date the division receives the request. A decision by the division that a request was not timely filed is not a dismissal and may be appealed pursuant to subsection (g) of this section."

The service in question was performed on June 10, 2024. The medical fee dispute was received by the Division on July 8, 2025. This date is more than a year following the in-question date(s) of service.

28 TAC §133.307 (c) (1) (A) states, "A request for MFDR that does not involve issues identified in subparagraph (B) of this paragraph shall be filed no later than one year after the date(s) of service in dispute."

A review of the submitted documentation finds that the disputed service(s) does not involve issues identified in 28 TAC §133.307 (c) (1) (B). The Division concludes that the Requester has

failed to timely file this dispute with the Division; consequently, the Requester has waived the right to medical fee dispute resolution.

### **Conclusion**

The outcome of this medical fee dispute is based on the evidence presented by the Requester and the respondent at the time of adjudication. Though all evidence may not have been discussed, it was considered.

The Division finds the Requester has not established that reimbursement is due.

### **Order**

Under Texas Labor Code §§413.031 and 413.019, the Division has determined the Requester is entitled to \$0.00 reimbursement for the disputed services.

### **Your Right to Appeal**

Either party to this medical fee dispute has a right to seek review of this decision under 28 TAC §133.307, which applies to disputes filed on or after **June 1, 2012**.

A party seeking review must submit DWC Form-045M, *Request to Schedule, Reschedule, or Cancel a Benefit Review Conference to Appeal a Medical Fee Dispute Decision (BRC-MFD)* and follow the instructions on the form. The Division must receive the request within **20 days** of when you receive this decision.
