Dr. Tammye Curtis-Jones is a retired Administrative Law Judge and Attorney in the State of Texas who has been a certified mediator since 2001. Since that time, she has served as a certified mediator for the United States Postal Service, mediating thousands of disputes involving issues such as discrimination, FMLA, disability, wages, leave, and terminations. Dr. Curtis-Jones has conducted several mediator trainings and serves as a lead mediator for the United States Postal Service in Houston. Dr. Curtis-Jones has served as a mediator for the Texas Department of Insurance billing disputes since the initiation of the program, mediating hundreds of billing dispute cases.

In addition, Dr. Curtis-Jones spent many years in state and federal government practice, where a great portion of her practice involved mediating various disputes in the areas of contracts, employment, construction, sports/athletics, licensing, medical, family, and intellectual property matters. In her tenure with state government, she conducted many trainings, including sessions on mediation and conflict resolution.

She holds an Ed.D in Organizational Leadership/Conflict Management from Abilene Christian University, a Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice from Sam Houston State University, and a Juris Doctorate from Thurgood Marshall School of Law.
