- Re: Report on fire standard compliant cigarettes

In 2009, <u>Health and Safety Code Section 796.017</u> established fire safety standards for cigarettes sold in Texas to self-extinguish when they're not being smoked. In addition to defining sale, testing, and certification standards, the code required that all packaging include a mark to show the cigarettes are fire standard compliant.

Cigarette manufacturers must send an application for mark approval to the State Fire Marshal's Office (SFMO). The application must be renewed every three years.

In fiscal year 2023, SFMO processed 17 new applications and six renewals. Texas fire departments reported that cigarette smoking caused 162 structure fires and 2,145 outdoor fires.

In fiscal year 2024, SFMO processed 15 new applications and 11 renewals. Due to reporting timelines, fiscal year 2024 fire statistics on the number of structure and outdoor fires caused by cigarettes won't be available until the second quarter of fiscal year 2025.
